Events & Field Trips

Every year begins with our Middle School Retreat. Each grade level attends a 3-5 day trip. Typically sixth grade travels to Northern Arizona, seventh grade travels to Catalina Island Marine Institute, and eighth grade travels to Washington, D.C.

The Gradual Release Model for Readiness Instruction

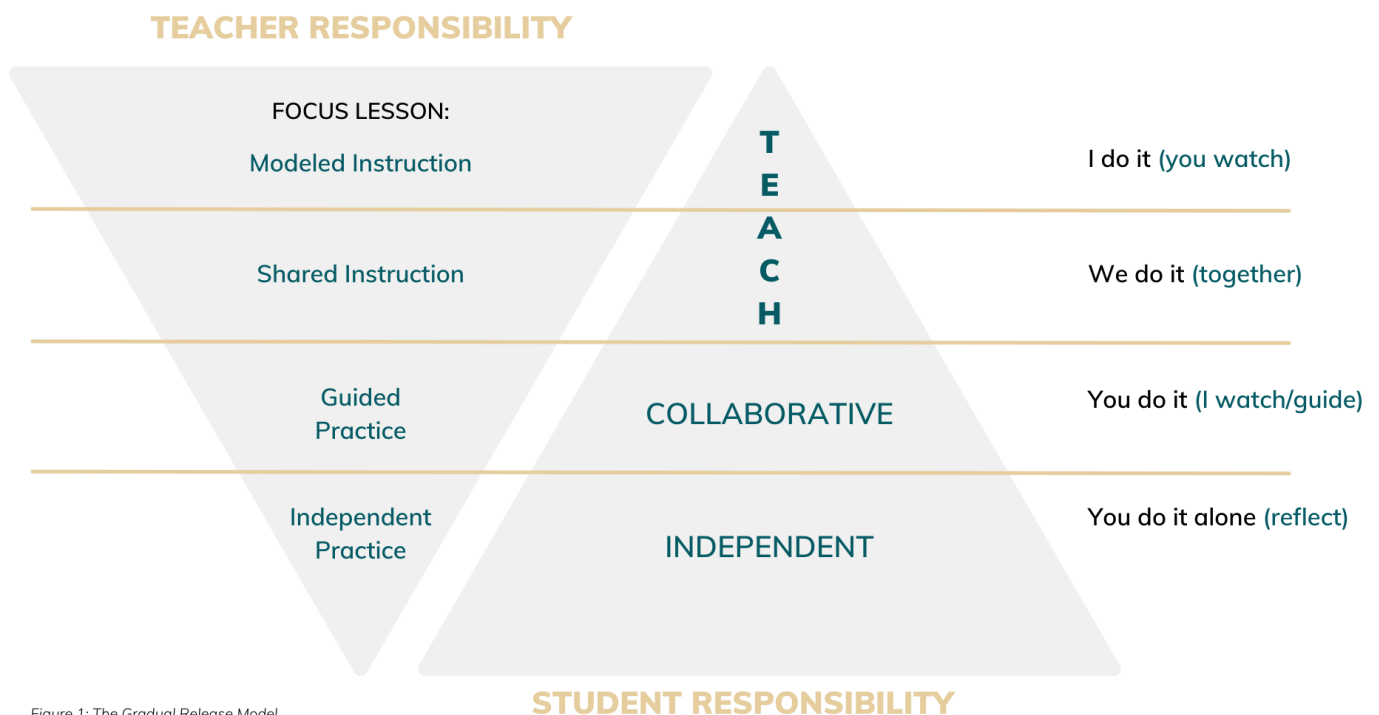


Figure 1: The Gradual Release Model
